As required by section 735 of the Tariff Act of 1930, the United States International Trade Commission has completed antidumping duty investigations concerning imports of Emulsion Styrene-Butadiene Rubber ("ESBR") from Czechia and Russia (Investigation Nos. 731-TA-1575 and 731-TA-1577 (Final)). You are hereby advised that the Commission has determined that an industry in the United States is not materially injured or threatened with material injury, and the establishment of an industry in the United States is not materially retarded by reason of imports of such merchandise that are sold in the United States at less than fair value.

The reasons for the Commission's determinations are set forth in its report on the investigations.
